


The Year of St Francis

A Call from Rome



Pope Leo XIV has announced the 'Year of St Francis' to mark 800 years since the saint's death. He invites us to reflect on a message of care, peace, and dignity.

We also remember that Pope Francis chose his name to follow this example: caring for the poor, protecting creation, and living simply.

St Francis?




Plant: He loved creation and the Earth.

Laudato Si' – Praise Be to You Singing Our Praise


These words come from a prayer by St Francis praising God for creation.

One Family of Creation



St Francis was inspired by the Psalm. He believed everything God made was part of one family. He called the Sun his 'Brother' and the Earth his 'Sister'. He wrote the 'Canticle of Creation' to praise God for these gifts. Today, we are called to treat the world not just as "things," but as family.

A Change of Heart



Francis lived many years ago. At first, he lived a comfortable, wealthy life.

But when he met people who were poor and sick, his heart changed. He chose to live simply. He cared for those who were lonely or forgotten. He cared for animals, plants, and the Earth.

The Wolf of Gubbio



In the town of Gubbio, a wolf frightened the people. They wanted to use force. But St Francis did not use anger. He spoke gently to the wolf and made a deal of peace.

Francis showed us that care and peace take courage. He proved that love can change hearts instead of fear.

Care for Creation — God's world is precious and must be protected.




Option for the Poor — We care especially for those who need help most.

Child 2: Praise be to you, God, for Sister Moon and the stars.


ALL: Help us care for your world.
