Importantly, we have sought to **balance the additional energy used in creating these resources** by making **all materials freely available to schools**, ensuring they can be widely shared, reused, and enjoyed. In this way, the energy invested becomes both justifiable and fruitful, serving the wider educational community rather than a single setting.

We invite schools to see this not as a flaw, but as a **living example of stewardship**. Even in our digital work, we are called to make thoughtful choices that protect our Common Home. We hope these resources bear much fruit in your school and help you celebrate this special year with integrity, joy, and responsibility.
